Meade offensive cold in 89-77 loss to Marion County

Meade County turned in a poor offensive showing on Saturday night against Marion County in the final game of the Marion County Basketball Invitational. The Green Wave shot better than 50% Friday night in an 84-68 win over Monroe County but shot only 44% against the Knights several of those field goals came late in the game when the contest was out of reach.

Marion County led 17-13 after the first quarter and stretched the lead to 43-31 at the half. The Knights had nine 3 pointers for the game and completely controlled the game in the second half.

"We just didn't shoot the ball well enough to stay in the game," said Coach Miller. "Our effort was good but we've got to find some more punch in the scoring

column."

Erwin Roberts had 24 points to lead Meade County. Roberts hit on 10 of 17 shots for 59% which helped offset the extremely poor shooting from the rest of the

team. Scott Parker had a career high of 23 points and sophomore Greg Sutton came off the bench and hit for seven points. Sutton hit 3 of 4 field goals and 1 of 1 free throw.

The Green Wave offense was handicapped to an extent by the fact that Jason Hobbs scored only 1 point. Hobbs was hobbled by a bad ankle and played very sparingly, going 0 for 4 from the field. He had been second leading

Roberts helps Green Wave reject Monroe 84-68

Senior Erwin Roberts disrupted the Monroe County offense by blocking ten shots in Meade County's 84-68 basketball win last Friday night in the first round of the Marion County Invitational. Roberts also fired in 20 points to pace the Green Wave.

Meade County trailed 22-18 at the end of the first quarter but got untracked for 31 second quarter points to take a 49-35 halftime lead. Senior guard Jason Hobbs led the Green Wave spurt with 8 quick points which included two pointers. Hobbs totaled 18 points for the game.

The Green Wave never allowed Monroe County to get within 10 points the rest of the way. Junior

center Joe Luney gave Meade solid scoring on the inside by hitting 4 of 5 field goals and 1 for 1 at the line for his best varsity effort. He scored 13 points, including several free throws down the stretch and totaled 13 points also.

Coach Larry Miller was relieved after his team coasted to the victory. "We really played well to have been out of action for 17 days. Everyone gave an excellent effort."

Meade County shot an excellent 51% from the field. Luney's 4 of 5 and Lamar Paige 3 of 4 contributed strongly to the good shooting performance.

Pinellas Park is the number three rated girls high school basketball team in Florida and it quickly showed the Lady Waves of Meade County why that is the case. Pinellas Park reeled off 16 straight points after Meade County had taken a 2-0 lead and coasted to a 58-35 win in the second round of the Male Classic.

The quickness caused Meade County major problems to the tune of 40 turnovers. "They put pressure on our point guards and we didn't handle it at all," said Coach Bob Pollock. "We didn't get the ball to our inside people and that is evident by the number of shots we got from our big peo-

ple." Strangely, even after playing so poorly, the Lady Waves pulled within nine points early in the final period. But the inability to cash in on three opportunities allowed Pinellas Park to pull away once again.

"Our effort was good once again but we just didn't execute," said Pollock. "As long as the kids are giving a good effort a coach has little room to complain."

Marie Barr had a solid performance in scoring 10 points and grabbing 10 rebounds. Rhonda Matthews hit for nine points.

Meade County is now 3-4 on the season and will face district rival

East Hardin at Glendale on Thursday.

Oldham County defeated Sheldon Clark 51-39 for the championship. Sheldon Clark defeated Pinellas Park 75-60 in the semi-

finals. It was the first loss for the team from Florida in 14 games.

FISHIN' TIPS FROM THE HUMMINBIRD PROS



Fishermen have a tendency to get impatient. This is especially true with a spinning lure. In such a condition, the lure needs a quick fix. The fix is to change the lure and while you're at it, change the bait at idle speed. Change 200 yards of line out behind the boat. Pull the line through the water for a hunt for a knot or so. This will tighten out your line and remove the kinks.

Before retying the lure, check the line between thumb and forefinger. Clip off above the thumb as this will weaken the line.
